Section C - Text Management

C1 - Educational Objectives

At the end of the studies related to this second level Academic Diploma, the student: will have demonstrated knowledge and understanding skills that extend and/or strengthen those typically associated with the first cycle and allow the elaboration and/or application of original ideas, often in a context of research; will be able to apply their knowledge, understanding and problem-solving skills to new or unfamiliar topics in broader (or interdisciplinary) contexts related to their field of study; will have the ability to integrate knowledge and manage complexity, as well as to formulate judgments on the basis of limited or incomplete information, including reflection on the social and ethical responsibilities associated with the application of one's knowledge and rationale underlying them, to specialist and unambiguously communicate their conclusions, as well as the knowledge and rationale underlying them, to specialist and non-specialist interlocutors; will have developed those learning skills that allow him to continue studying mostly in a self-directed or autonomous way.

C2 - Final Exam

Execution of a concert program lasting at least 40 minutes and detailed presentation in written form (thesis) of a topic related to the musical program performed. The pieces presented cannot be the same ones performed during the exam of Executive practice and repertoires II.

C3 - Employment prospects

The course offers students employment opportunities in the following areas: - Solo instrumentalist - Orchestral formations instrumentalist in chamber formations - Teaching.

C4 - Knowledge and understanding

At the end of the studies related to this second level Academic Diploma, the student must have demonstrated the knowledge and understanding on which it builds on and extends and/or improves that typically associated with the first cycle and which provides a basis or an opportunity for the originality in the development and/or application of ideas, often in a research context.

C5 - Ability to apply knowledge and understanding

Upon completion of studies related to this second level Academic Diploma, the student can apply their knowledge and understanding and problem solving skills in new or unfamiliar environments in broader (or multidisciplinary) contexts related to their field of study.

C6 - Making judgments

At the end of the studies related to this second level Academic Diploma, the student must have demonstrated the ability to integrate knowledge and manage complexity and formulate judgments with incomplete or limited information, but which include reflection on the social and ethical responsibilities related to application of their knowledge and judgments.

C7 - Communication skills

At the end of the studies related to this second level Academic Diploma, the student can communicate his conclusions and the knowledge and motivations behind them, to a specialized and non-specialized public in a clear and unequivocal way.

C8 - Learning skills

Upon completion of the studies related to this Master's Academic Diploma, the student will have the learning skills to enable him to continue studying in a way which may be largely self-directed or autonomous.
